- Attended a meeting during the month of June, worked with Park and Planning to renew application for Central Avenue Metro Blue Line called Sustainable Community Action Plan. It qualifies the Town to receive grants from Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development.

- Ebony Inn clean up. Mr. Pinkney did a great job. I think we should send something to the County, thanking them for their partnering with us.

-Sustainable Community Green Team -Sustainable Maryland certification grants are not based on one's ability to write the grants it's based on you having priority and you are part of other programs and policies for the State of Md. We registered December 7th, 2015, the council passed a resolution, it is part of Park and Planning renewal application. Funds, grants training tools and expert guidance. It attracts private funding to Lowe's, Home Depot, this is the advantage in sustainable Maryland. Have to score 150 points to become a sustainable community. We get 10 points for having the green team.

Mayor Martin asked the Pleasure of the Council concerning getting a Green Team. The Council agreed. We can get a resolution ready for the Town Meeting.

-Chesapeake Bay Trust Fund- we can apply for a grant between \$10,000 and \$50,000, the Council have to pass a resolution in support of grant.

-Morehouse School of Medicine- the deadline is next week, July 21. Community Health grant, provide health related activities. A good idea is the Greater Fairmount Heights Fresh Community Garden Health Initiative.

Former Mayor Waiters-we have had conversations concerning when we do initiatives around town we don't have a watering system. Need a solar energy irrigation system. Landscaping, architecture and engineering needed to build an irrigation system.
